= Looking like Jesus

Eph 4:15

"but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him who is the head, even Christ"

The process by which God brings His children to maturity is called:

"Discipline"

A function of His love (vs. 6)

Heb 12:6

"For those whom the Lord loves He disciplines,

And he scourges every son He receives."

"Discipline"

Gr. paideia lit. "the rearing of a child" ·Instruction ·Training •Correction

·Instruction

Truth/knowledge

The Scriptures

2 Tim 3:16

"All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness"

(you have forgotten...vs 5)

·Training -

The application of knowledge

Testing

Heb 12:11

"All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness"

(Church wasn't being punished – facing opposition, vs. 3-4)

Discipline isn't just a beating!

Sometimes it is God educating us through a (often painful) hands on application of truth

(Job 31)

·Correction -

To steer back on course

Heb 12:10

"...He disciplines us for our good, so that we may share in His holiness"

holiness – separation from sin

"All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful;

God's steering can be painful.

•1 Cor 11:30

•Acts 5:5

3 ways:

#1 - Reject it (vs 5a)

"Do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord"

#2 -Become dejected by it (vs 5b)

"...nor faint when you are
reproved by Him"

Proves you are His child (vs 7-8)

#3 - Accept it and grow vs 9-11 Know that it yields fruit

·Life - vs 9

·Holiness - vs 10

•Peace and Righteousness – vs 11

- #3 Accept it and grow vs 9-11
- Receive it as a matter of faith -
 - · God is always disciplining us.
- "Endure hardship as discipline" vs 7Where am I in the process?

Is God trying to equip me with truth?

Is He training me - giving me an opportunity to apply truth?

Is He correcting me because I'm off course?
