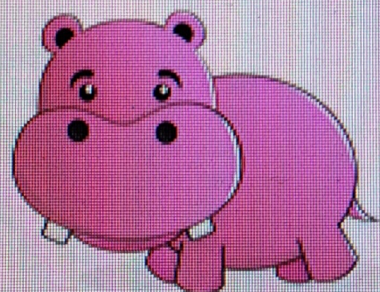
What is the verb for generosity?
