Faith this Grace, Peace, Intimacy with
Jesus, Divine power, God touching thing

Goodness this unbridled moral muscles; a
passionate and fiery preference of right to
wrong

...and to goodness, knowledge;

Knowledge this deeper and enlarged
knowing of a holy, righteous, loving,
just, all powerful, all knowing, and
living God

...and to knowledge, self-control...

Self-control this ability to stay on
course in the face of internal resistance
and conflicts

...and to self-control, perseverance...

Perseverance this ability to stay on
course in the face of external resistance
and conflicts

...and to perseverance, godliness...

Godliness this capability and privilege
to be like God

...and to godliness, brotherly
kindness...

Brotherly-kindness this life changing
affection for brothers and sisters in
Christ

Vs 8

For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ

Vs 9

But if anyone does not have them, he is
nearsighted and blind, and has forgotten
that he has been cleansed from his past
sins.

...and to brotherly kindness, love

Agapao or Agape

Agapao speaks of a love which is
awakened by a sense of value in an
entity

Agapao speaks of love that acts
regardless of the worthiness of the
receiver

Agapao (Love) this affection and
passion that compels one to move
toward and connect to

John 3:19

Men loved (*agapao*) darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

John 12:43

For they loved (*agapao*) the praise of men more than the praise of God

2 Timothy 4:10

Demas has forsaken me, having loved
(*agapao*) this present world.

Luke 11:43

Woe to you Pharisees! For you love
(*agapao*) the best seats

2 Peter 2:15

They have forsaken the right way...
following the way of Balaam... who
loved (*agapao*) the wages
of unrighteousness.

Because without
Goodness Knowledge Self-control
Perseverance Godliness Brotherly-kindness

We will be tempted to misdirect our
affection and passion and be compelled
to move toward and connect to the less
or even the harmful

Love this affection and passion that
compels one to move toward and
connect to

If love does not compel us to move
toward and connect to, then we will not
be in position to dispense
