To put that in perspective, according to Computerworld magazine, Yahoo – the Internet giant – has created a specially-built 2.0 petabyte "data warehouse". Yahoo uses the immense information storage capacity of this data warehouse to analyze the behavior of its half-a-billion monthly visitors. "It is not only the world's singlelargest database, but also the busiest"

Yet Yahoo's 2.0 petabyte computational center which can process 24 billion "events" a day, is a full 20 percent smaller than the capacity of a single human brain which is 2.5 petabyte. Average adult human brain has the ability to store the equivalent of 2.5 million gigabytes digital memory.
